Orders for the 2025 Tree Seedling Sale will be accepted through **Friday March 14, 2025** or until supplies are exhausted. Orders are taken on a first come, first served basis. All orders must be picked up at the District Office between **8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. on Friday April 4th or between 8:00 am –10:00 am Saturday April 5th.** Full payment must accompany all orders. Sorry, we cannot accept credit/debit cards.

## Packet #

<b>1 - White Pine:</b> <i>Pinus strobus</i> (25/ pkt) 4-0 YR (10"-20") Excellent for windbreak and hedges. Prefers acidic, well drained soils.	<b>2 - Colorado Blue Spruce:</b> <i>Picea pungens</i> (25/pkt) 5-0 yr (10"-20") Used for landscape, windbreaks, reforestation and Christmas trees. Adaptable to variety of soils.
<b>3 - Norway spruce:</b> <i>Picea abies</i> (25/pkt) 3-0 YR (10"-16") Used for ornamentals, timber and wind/snow breaks. Adapts to variety of soil types.	<b>4 - Jack Pine:</b> <i>Pinus banksiana</i> (25/pkt) 2-0 (18"-24") Tolerates a wide range of soil, but needs full sun. Prefers areas with early frost
<b>5 - Red Spruce:</b> <i>Picea rubens</i> (25/pkt) 2-0 (10"-18") Great for wildlife, will likely be grazed by deer, squirrels. Sensitive to air pollution. Slow grower that prefers shallow topsoil.	<b>6 - Balsam Fir:</b> <i>Abies balsamea</i> Cooks Blue (25/ pkt) 2-3 (10"-16") Loves glacial till soil (90% of Ash Co), in a pH range of 4.0 to 6.0, best in cold, moist climate. Slow grower, 18 feet in 20 years
<b>7 - Douglas Fir:</b> <i>Pseudotsuga menziesii</i> (25/pkt) 2-2 (6"-12") Seed source proven to be resistant to Gypsy Moth. Grows best in moist, well drained soil.	<b>8 - Mockernut Hickory:</b> <i>Carya tomentosa</i> (5/ pkt), 2-0 yr (6"-12") Slow growing, takes 25 years before an edible nut is produced. Straight trunk makes it great for shade tree in the yard.
<b>9 - Scarlet Oak:</b> <i>Quercus coccinea</i> (5/pkt.) 4-0 yr (18"-36") Likes loamy, acidic, well-drained soil. Beautiful dark green foliage to scarlet in fall. Drought resistant.	<b>10 - Shumard Oak:</b> <i>Quercus shumardii</i> (5/pkt) 4 yr (36"-48") AKA Swamp Red Oak. Tolerates a wide variety of soil types, including poorly drained soils. Fast grower. High wildlife value.
<b>11 - Chestnut Oak:</b> <i>Quercus prinus</i> (5/pkt) 3-0 yr (24"-48") Loves moist, medium textured soil. Resembles an American chestnut tree.	<b>12 - Northern Pecan:</b> <i>Carya illinoensis</i> (5/pkt) 1-0 yr (12"-18") Grows best in loamy, well-drained soil that does not have prolonged standing water. Larval host to Gray Hairstreak butterfly.
<b>13 - Sugar Maple:</b> <i>Acer saccharum</i> (5/pkt) 3-0 yr (8"-16")   Adaptable to different soils, important for wildlife and pollinators.	<b>14 - Domestic Apple:</b> <i>Malus domestica</i> (5/pkt) 2-0 yr (12-18") Common apple, not a cultivar.
<b>15 - Roselow Sarg. Crabapple</b> <i>Malus sargentii</i> 'Roselow' (5/ pkt) 2-0 yr (6"-12") 20 ft max height, great street tree. Great windbreak, hedgerow.	<b>16 - American Hazelnut:</b> <i>Corylus americana</i> (5/ pkt) 1-0 yr (12"-18") Shrub with height of 16 ft. Easily grown in average, medium, well-drained soil in full sun to part shade.
<b>17 - Black Elderberry:</b> <i>Sambucus canadensis</i> (5/pkt) 1-0 yr (12"-18") Tolerates wide variety of soils, edible fruit, high wildlife value. 5-12 feet tall, usually wider than tall. Streambank stabilizer.	<b>18 - Highbush Blueberry:</b> <i>Vaccinium corymbosum</i> (5/pkt) RC+1 yr (6"-12") Tolerates wide variety of soils, edible fruit, high wildlife value. 6-12 feet tall shrub. Streambank stabilizer
<b>19 - Highbush Cranberry:</b> <i>Viburnum trilobum</i> (5/pkt) 1-0 yr (12"-18") Tolerates wide variety of soils, edible fruit, high wildlife value. 8-12 feet tall shrub. Streambank stabilizer	<b>20 - Redbud:</b> <i>Cercis canadensis</i> (5/pkt) 1-0 yr (12"-18") Showy native that grows to 30'. Part shade to shade. Likes moist soils that drain.
<b>21 - Sweet Shrub:</b> <i>Calycanthus floridus</i> (5/pkt) 1-0 yr (18"-24") aka Carolina Allspice. Shrub that tolerates wide range of soil and sun to part shade. Very fragrant. Pollinated by sap beetles.	<b>22 - 55 gal plastic rain barrel with diverter kit, standard 2"x3" downspout size</b>
